## To Whom It May Concern:

Jeffrey Deskovic was a guest speaker at the annual in-house legal seminars of the New York State Supreme Court, Appellate Divisions, held in Brooklyn, New York, on April 9, 2014. Approximately 35 appellate judges were present from the 1st, 2nd and 3rd Departments and heard Mr. Deskovic render a cogent presentation on the issue of "actual innocence," which is a growing and important topic in statewide and national jurisprudence.

Mr. Deskovic's remarks were well-organized, educational, current, interesting, and at times, gripping. He identified particular signs for judges to look for in adjudicating actual innocence claims.
